



FACILITY TRACER MEDICINES STOCK STATUS SUMMARY REPORT September 2021

INTRODUCTION

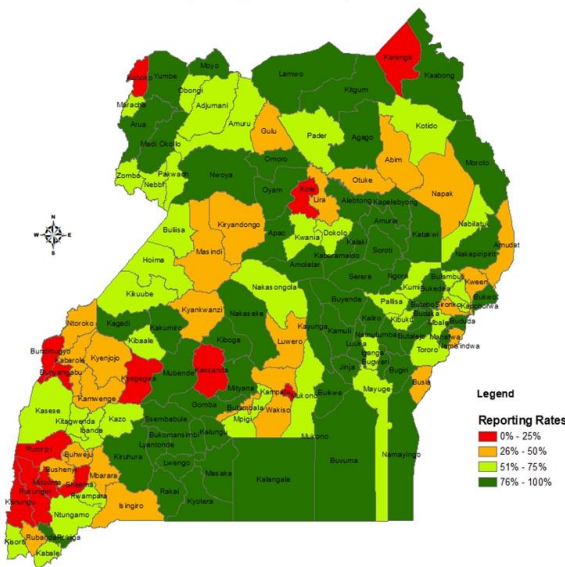
The report aims to inform the Ministry of Health and stakeholders' planning and logistics decisions to ensure a robust health commodities supply chain. This report provides an update of the health facility stock status data and HMIS 105-section 6 reporting for 38 tracer commodities (in different baskets) countrywide. The report shows the percentages of facilities that are submitting reports into DHIS2, Out of stock, Under-stocked, Appropriately Stocked, and Overstocked based on Months of Stock.

KEY FINDINGS

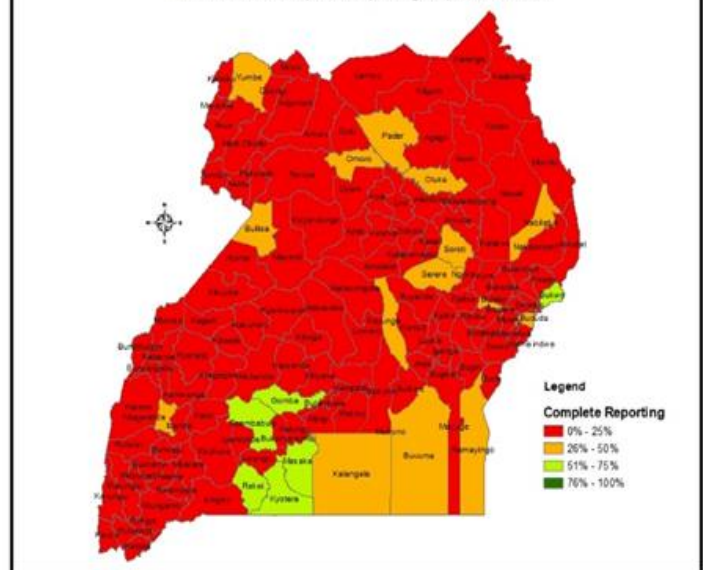
Reporting Rate HMIS105–Section 6

64%(n=4198) of GoU and Private Not for Profit Health Facilities submitted monthly stock status reports with all 3 data elements (Stock on hand, Quantity consumed and Days out of stock) , Complete reporting of all tracer commodities eligible for facilities still low at **9%**.

HMIS 105-6 Reporting Rates September 2021

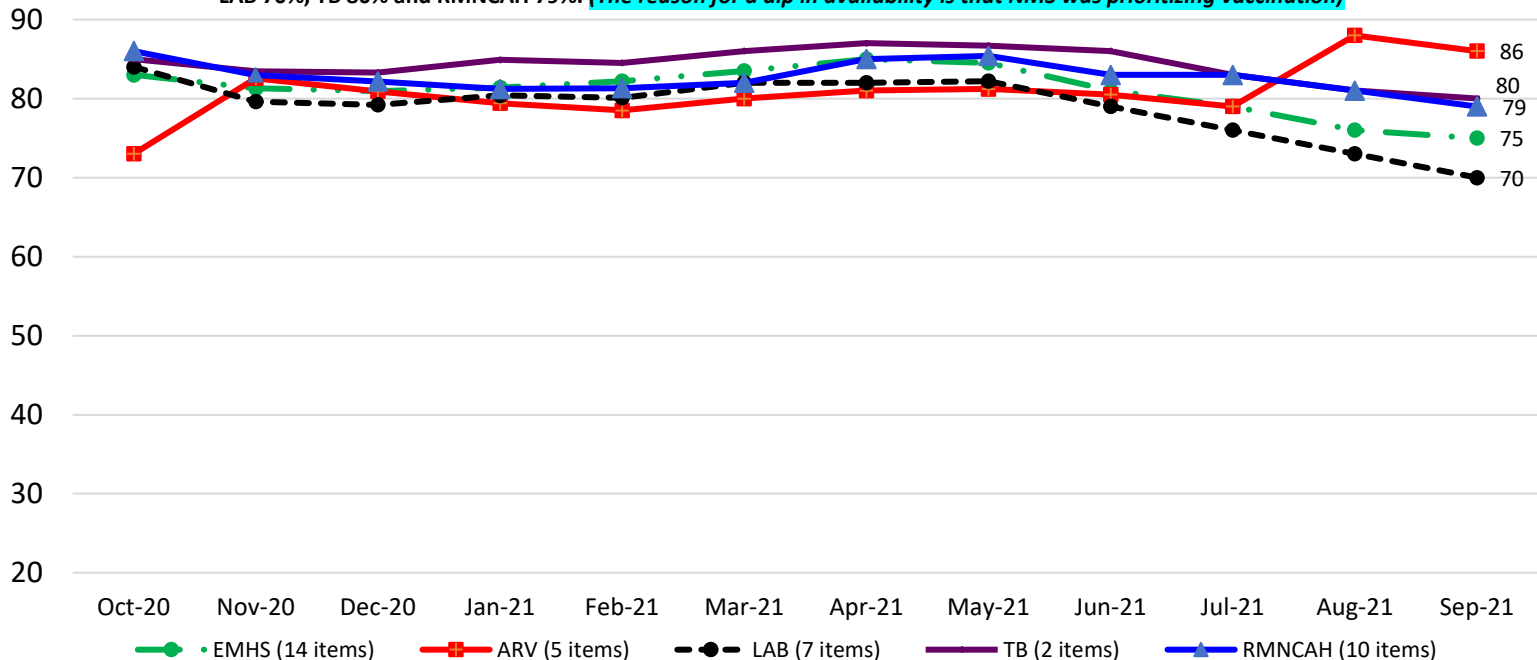


HMIS 105-6 Complete Reporting September 2021

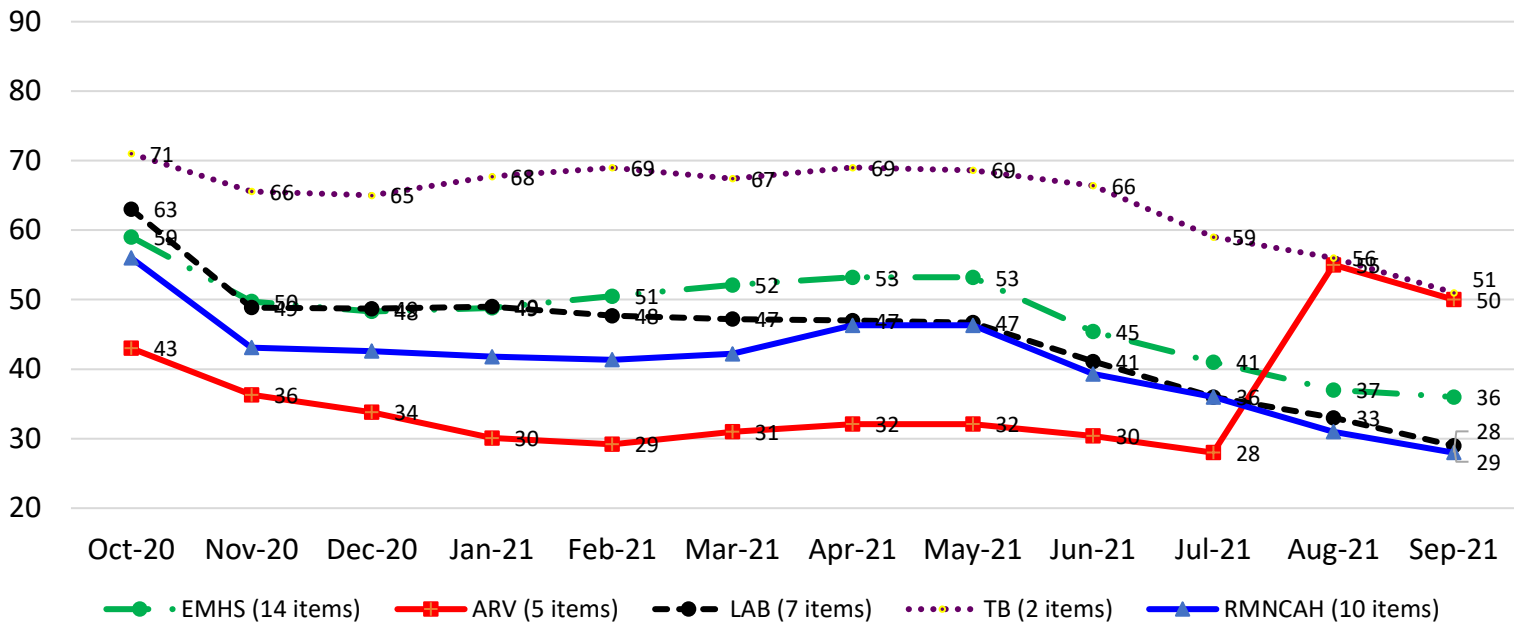


Availability

Overall Average Availability for the Basket of 38 commodities is 78% as at September 2021 where EMHS 75%, ARV 86%, LAB 70%, TB 80% and RMNCAH 79%. *(The reason for a dip in availability is that NMS was prioritizing vaccination)*

September 2021**



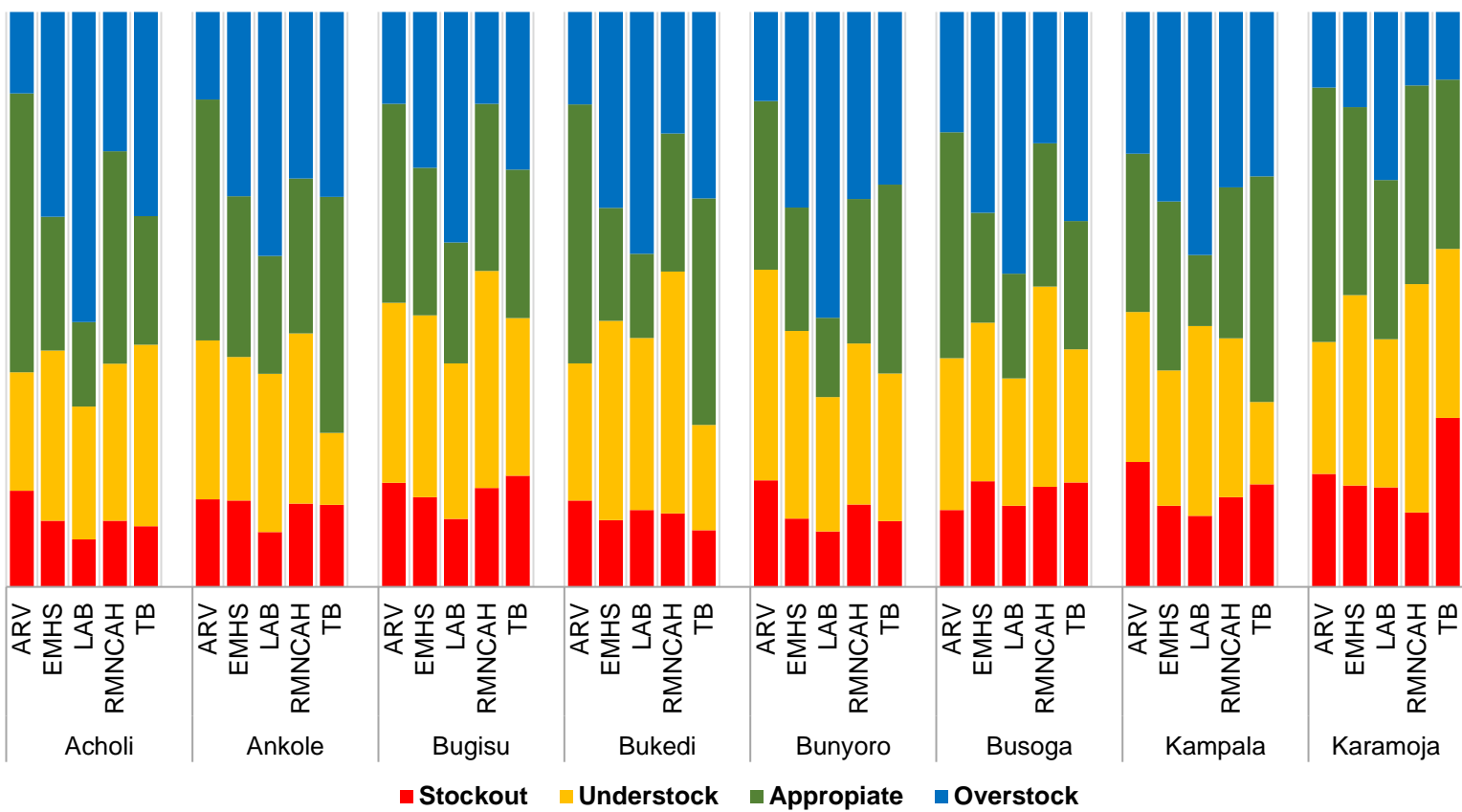
Expired commodities:
Blood (8%), GeneXpert Cartridges (2%), DPMA (1.6%), RHZ (1.6%) and Determine (1.6%)

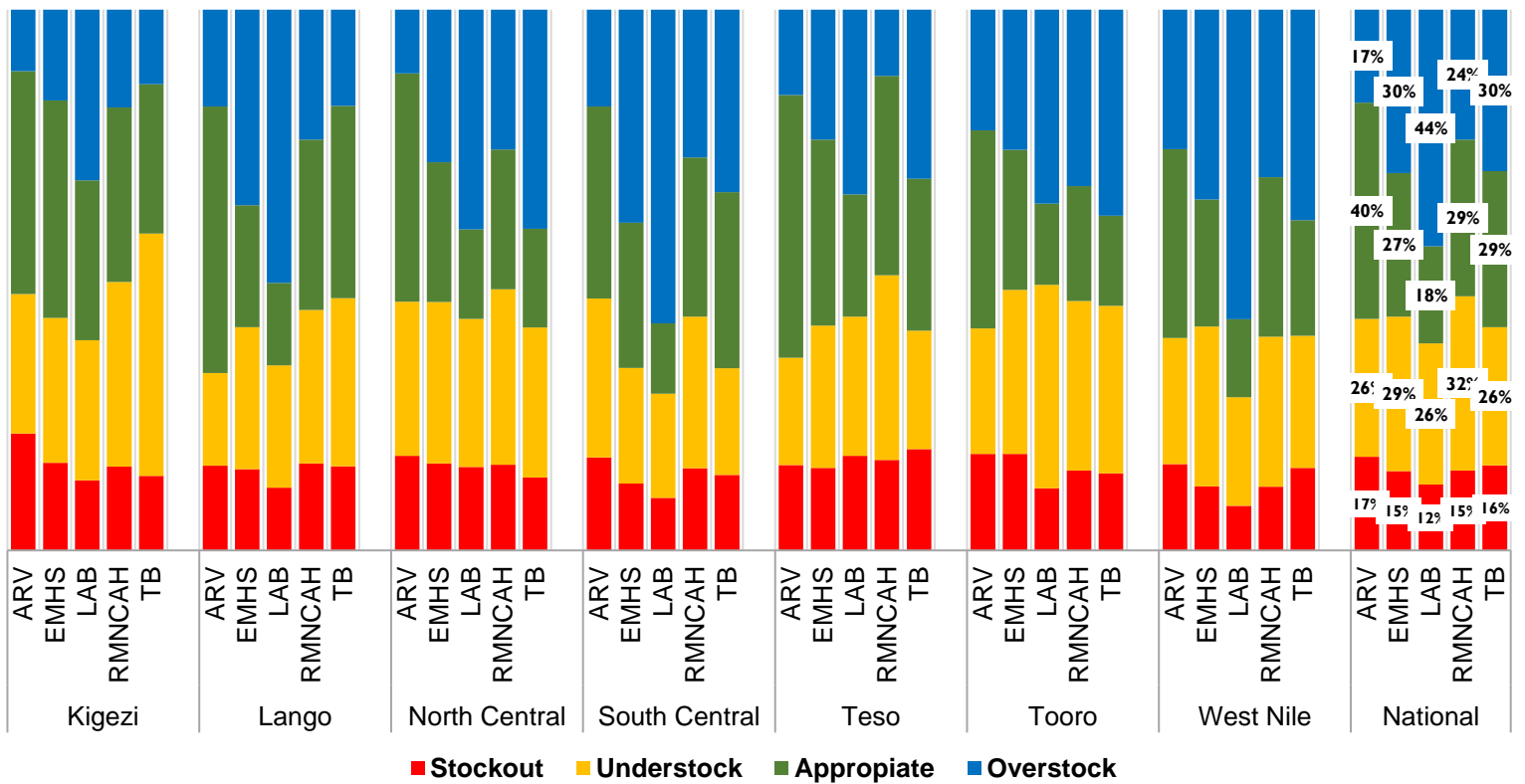
Stocked out commodities:
CD4 Reagents (81%), SD-Bioline (78%), RUTF (67%), Stat-pack (56%) and Therapeutic Milk (54%)

Overstocked commodities:
S/P (54%), TDF/3TC 300/300mg (48%), ATV/r 300/100mg (47%), Misoprostol (46%), Artemether (42%) and DMPA (38%)

Short dated commodities < 2 months to expiry: (N=230 HF's /PIP)
Insulin short-acting (19%), Stat-pack (17%), S/P (17%), Artemether/Lumefantrine (11%) & Metformin (10%)

17% of Facilities reported stock out of the basket of ARV commodities and 44% reported overstock of the basket of LAB commodities Nationally.





Follow-up of Action Points for August 2021 Report

Department of Pharmacy and Natural Medicines

- Continue engaging with districts and partners to address SC reporting and HMIS 105 completeness gaps. *(This was done in the month of September and it's a continuous activity)*
- Follow up with NMS to fast-track delivery of commodities to districts and health facilities *(This is done continuously)*

Implementing Partners

- Regional IPs to continue supporting and engaging districts to improve HMIS 105 -6 reporting and data quality including completeness. *(This was done but there's need to intensify it)*
- Regional IPs to continue supporting districts to integrate SC review in all planned data reviews both at the district and health facilities. *(Not extensively done by the Regional IPs)*
- Support districts to redistribute commodities from over stocked health facilities to those that reported stock outs for essential supplies.

Action Points from the September 2021 Report

Department of Pharmacy and Natural Medicines

- Continue engaging with districts and implementing partners to address HMIS 105 completeness gaps.
- Working closely with DHI, continue supporting digitization of the SC up to health facility level to improve availability of real time data for quick decisions such as detecting potential expiries.
- Follow up with partners and central warehouses to ensure availability of essential commodities at health facilities.

Implementing Partners

- Regional IPs to intensify engagements with district leaders and health facility managers to improve HMIS 105-6 reporting and completeness.
- Regional IPs to continue supporting districts to integrate SC review in all planned data reviews both at the district and health facilities.
- Support districts to redistribute commodities from over stocked health facilities to those that reported stock outs for essential supplies.
- All Implementing Partners to provide an update at the next CSG on actions being undertaken to improve quality of Health Facility Reports at the next CSG
- All Implementing Partners to continue an analysis of the stock status of all commodities at each health facility to support stock transfers where possible; Updates on stock transfers to be shared at the next CSG.
- NMS to provide a detailed update on Cycle-by-Cycle order fulfillment status
