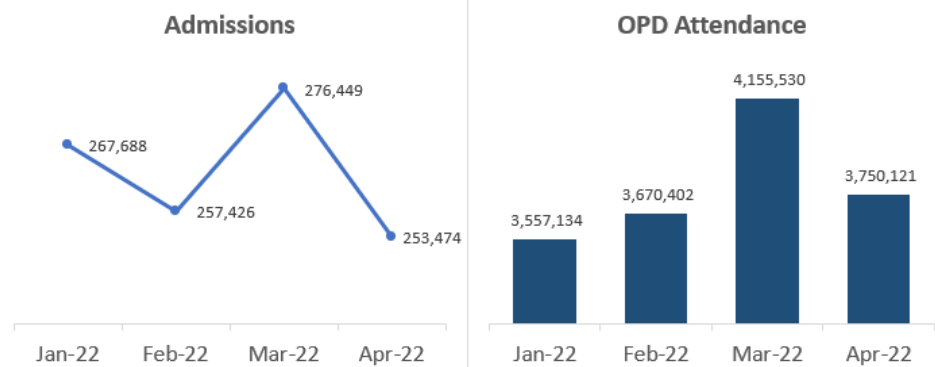
Introduction:

It provides an overview of; OPD attendance, admissions, top causes of mortality and morbidity, teenage pregnancy, Maternal & Perinatal deaths and public health events



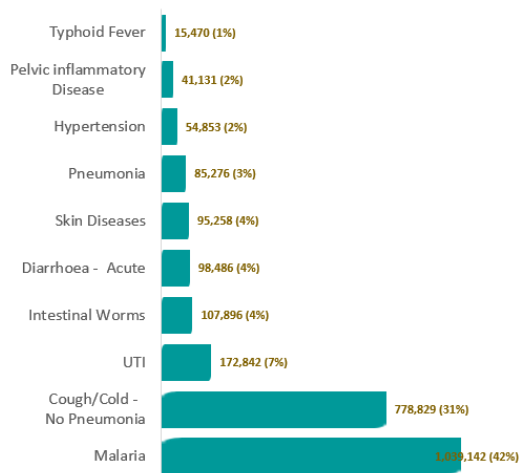

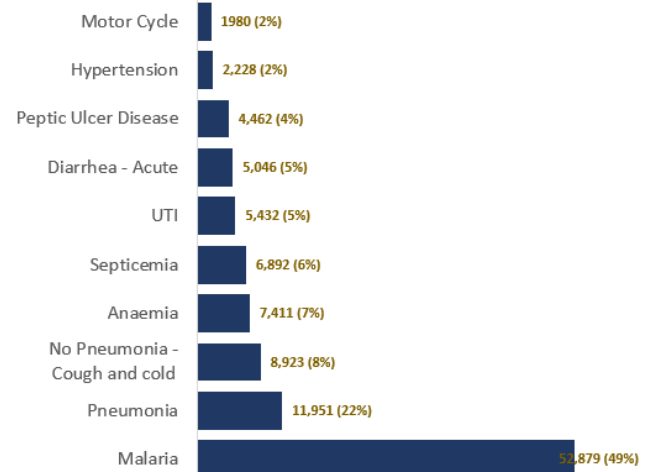
- Decline in OPD attendance and admissions



Leading Causes of Morbidity-OPD

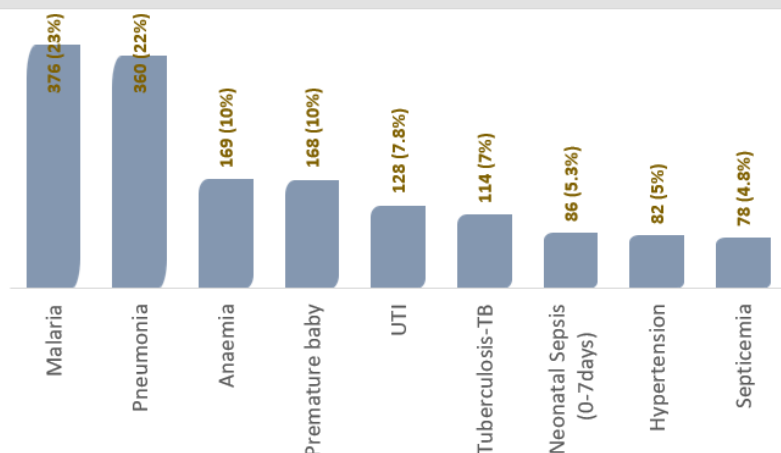


Leading Causes of Admission-IPD

- ◆ Pneumonia - 360 (20%)

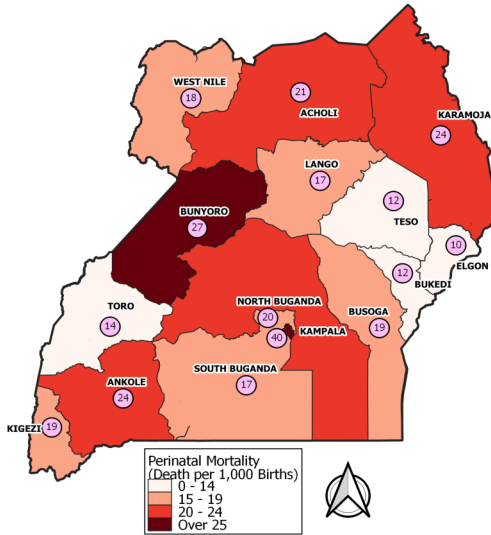

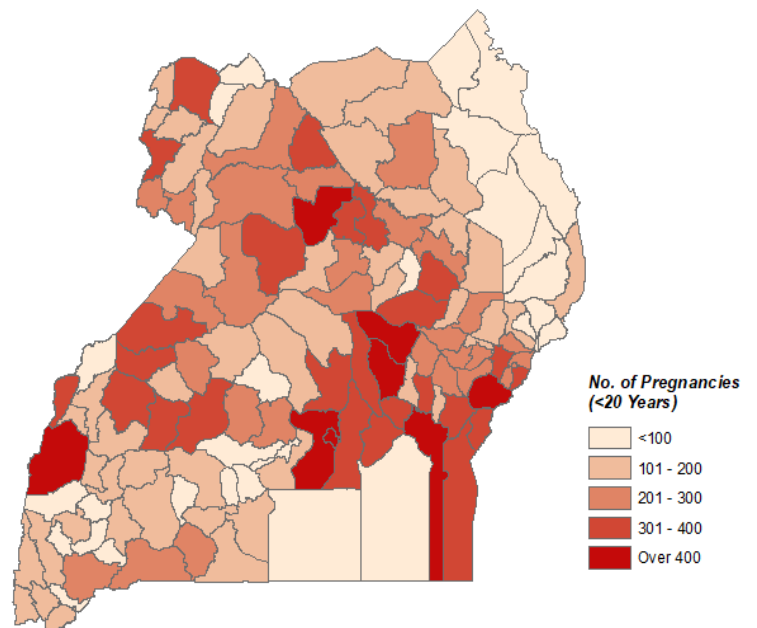
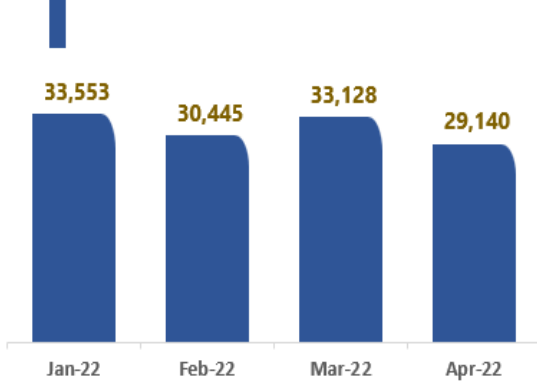

Teenage Pregnancy-29,140

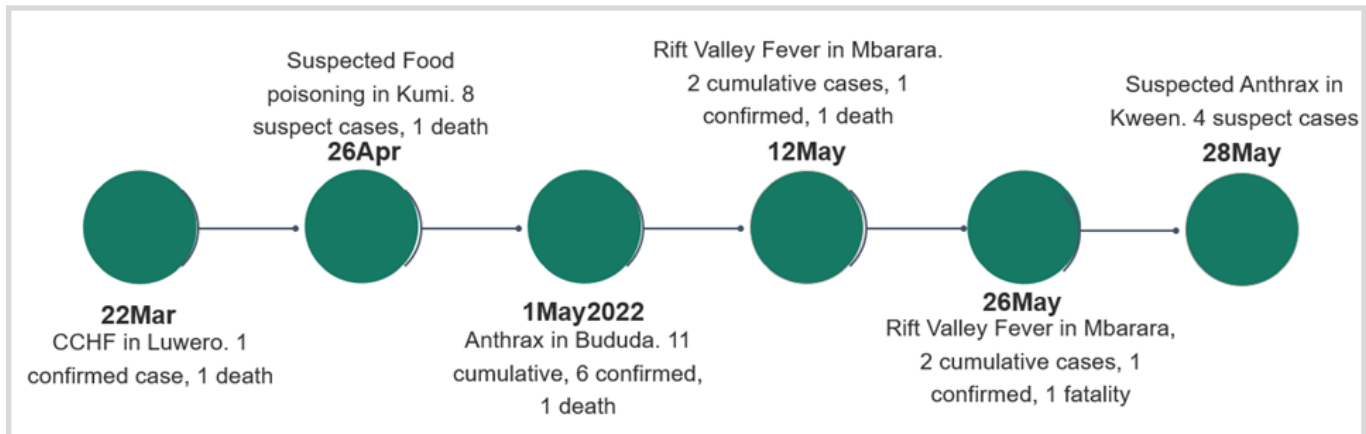


- Overall number of teenage pregnancies were 12% lower than those registered in March 2022.
- Highest number in Wakiso, Kampala, Kasese, Kamuli, Mayuge, Oyam, Tororo and Buyende Districts.



Public health events, 22 March – 28 May, 2022

The Ministry of Health is currently responding to an ongoing Anthrax outbreak in Bududa district and Rift valley fever in Mbarara. On 28 May 2022, suspected Anthrax outbreak was reported in Kween district, further investigations are underway.



Preparedness for Ebola and Monkeypox

- Democratic Republic of Congo declared a third outbreak in Equateur province on 23 April 2022. This triggered heightened surveillance in high-risk districts of Uganda at points of entry, communities and health facilities.
- As the Monkeypox situation evolves in various continents, Uganda has developed a contingency plan to enable preparedness measures for prevention, quick detection and response in the event of an importation.
