EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Ministry of Health Statistical Abstract is an annual report that gives a statistical summary of the inputs and outputs of the health sector. The main objective of the abstract is to create a platform for the dissemination of health information, which is needed for policy formulation, planning, monitoring and evaluation, resource mobilization and allocation in the health sector by health managers and other stakeholders. The report is presented in five chapters.

Section one gives the demographic characteristics of Uganda, highlighting the district level administrative units. The 2009 mid year population of Uganda is projected to be 30.7 million with 52% female and 48% male.

Section two presents a broader view of the health sector inputs (Human Resource for Health, Health Infrastructure and Finance). The above mentioned inputs are critical in health sector performance and their inadequacy continues to affect overall performance of the sector. Despite the fact that some health inputs are still inadequate, the abstract presents some indicators surpassing set targets, which is a positive trend indicating that if more resources are allocated to the sector the level of performance will increase.

Section three looks at the functionality of Health Centre IVs which are considered to be the most feasible means of ensuring universal access to most key components of the UNMHCP. Adequate resources are required to ensure functionality of the HC IVs in order for the sector to realize some of the major outputs like deliveries in health units and surgical procedures.

The fourth section presents key health outputs ranging from accessibility, services, utilization and quality indicators. Despite significant improvement in performance some health indicators remain far below the set target. This requires continuous support supervision, monitoring and evaluation of sector performance for better outputs and health outcomes.

The last section highlights the major causes of morbidity with malaria ranking highest. The diseases are also analyzed by gender and age segregation. The sector is however working tirelessly to lessen the disease burden through various proactive approaches.

1.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

Uganda is a land locked country located in East Africa, bordered by Sudan in the north, Kenya in the east, Tanzania and Rwanda in the south and Democratic Republic of Congo in the west. It covers 241,551 square kilometers, of which 197,323 square kilometers is land area. The country is divided into 80 Districts all of which have a decentralized local governance system. The districts have various land sizes and populations. With its population growing at the rate of 3.2% per annum, Uganda has one of the highest growth rates in the world and higher than the Sub-Saharan Africa average of 2.4%

Only 49% of households have access to health care facilities in Uganda. Access to health care facilities has been limited by poor infrastructure, especially in the rural areas where the majority of the population lives.

In order to address these issues, the Government of Uganda developed a Health Sector Strategic Plan which addresses the issues of access to health services through political structure that run from the district up to parish level.

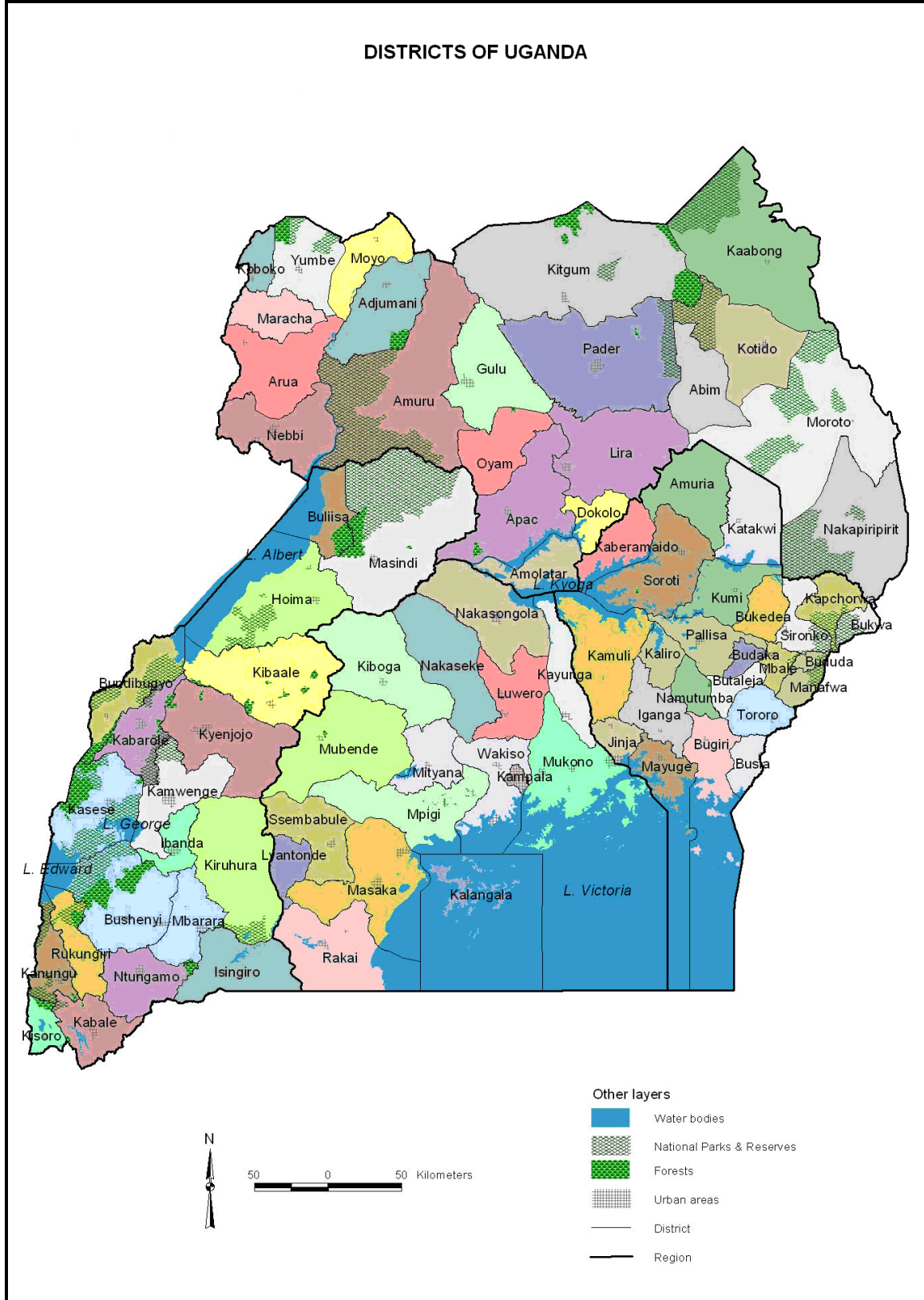
The Population census conducted in 2002 put the total population of Uganda at 24.7 million persons. The projected 2009 midyear population is 30.7 million with the following characteristics:

2.0 HEALTH INPUTS

The inputs to the health system comprise of infrastructure, equipment, human resources, drugs and finances. These are the building blocks and important inputs in the implementation of the Uganda National Minimum Health Care Package (UNMHCP).

2.1 HEALTH FACILITIES

The delivery of the UNMHCP is largely dependant on facilities; requiring buildings, equipment, communication facilities and vehicles. The HSSP II objective for the health infrastructure development was to ensure that 85% of the population lies within 5km walking distance to access a well equipped health facility regardless of level. As HSSP II started, the equipping of health facilities in the country was very bad at all levels especially in the newly created health facilities.

Equipping of hospitals had been neglected for sometime and concentration was on Health Centres. About 60% of the available equipment was obsolete; there is poor communication, transport and ambulatory services at all levels posing a big challenge to effective and efficient implementation of health care delivery services like referral.

Functionality of health facilities largely depends on adequate staffing levels, financial inputs, availability of equipment and maintenance mechanisms, social services among others. Where these are lacking functionality remains a big challenge. It is also noted that remote districts are most affected due to poor staff attraction and retention, poor social services among others.

2.1.1 HOSPITALS

Hospitals play a major role in the provision of health care and it was envisaged that with the strengthening of hospitals services, integrated clinical care would effectively be delivered. The HSSP II prioritized improvement of emergency care services and the consolidation of essential clinical services. The National hospital policy also clearly spells out the priority of ensuring basic essential clinical care through provision of emergency services and care of common illnesses and injuries through hospitals and lower health facilities.

National Referral hospitals

There are two national referral hospitals; Butabika hospital which was established in 1955 and the only mental health hospital in the country. Mulago hospital is the biggest national referral hospital and it serves as a teaching hospital as well. The national referral hospitals provide comprehensive specialist services and are involved in teaching and health research.

Regional Referral hospitals

These hospitals provide specialist services such as psychiatric, ear, nose and throat (ENT), radiology, pathology, ophthalmology, high level surgical and medical services in addition to services offered at the general hospitals.

General Hospitals

General hospitals have continued to provide a large output of outpatient and inpatient services. They however continue to face serious resource constraints (financial, human, poor infrastructure etc) and this contributes significantly to the reduction of the standard unit of output in these hospitals.

2.2 HUMAN RESOURCES FOR HEALTH

Human Resources for Health are essential for the effective operation of the health systems and an important input in the attainment of HSSP II objectives.

The Human Resources for Health are noted to be having a steady increase in FY 2008/09 due to the recruitment drive that was instituted in 2008. However the level of staffing is still low and the regional distribution remains inequitable. This is specifically seen in areas that are poorly resourced in terms of social infrastructure and amenities are remote.

Other limitations that have greatly curtailed HRH are;

- Limited funding for recruitment; couple with lengthy recruitment processes and inadequate competencies in handling the recruitment process at the district level.
- Low training outputs and high attrition: outputs from the training institutions do not match service requirements
- Poor retention which is accelerated by poor motivational factors, work environment and remuneration.

Critical cadres e.g. medical officers, clinical officers are still thin on ground for example Hoima and Kabale Regional Referral hospitals with 5 and 6 doctors respectively. There is a marked improvement though, in some cadres like the nurses. In order to improve HRH capacity, efforts should be put in place to ensure optimal recruitment of health workers to fill critical vacancies in the sector.

2.3. FINANCING IN THE HEALTH SECTOR

Financing is one of the six interdependent health system building blocks, the others being the workforce, services, technology, information and governance. The per capita health expenditure in Uganda is estimated at USD 33, of which the public sector contributes 14.4%, development partners 35.6% and household 50% (MOH, NHA 06 - 07). More than 9% of the house hold expenditure is spent on out of pocket health expenses. The per capita requirement for the provision of UNMHCP in all facilities is estimated at USD 41.2 in 2008/09 and is expected to rise to USD 47.9 in the financial year 2011/12 (HSLP Africa limited, 2008). This trend has important implications for service delivery as it will imply the need for further priority setting based on the UNMHCP.

The total sector budget increased significantly over the last three years of HSSP II. In FY 2007/08, the sector budget increased by 12.1% and by 46.7% in FY 2008/09. The rise can be attributed to increased allocation to health and donor support to the sector. The sector is financed through government revenue, PHP sources and development assistance under the SWAP arrangement. Table 9 below, shows the

health sector financial performance in 2008/09.

3.2 HEALTH CENTER IV FUNCTIONALITY FY 2008/09

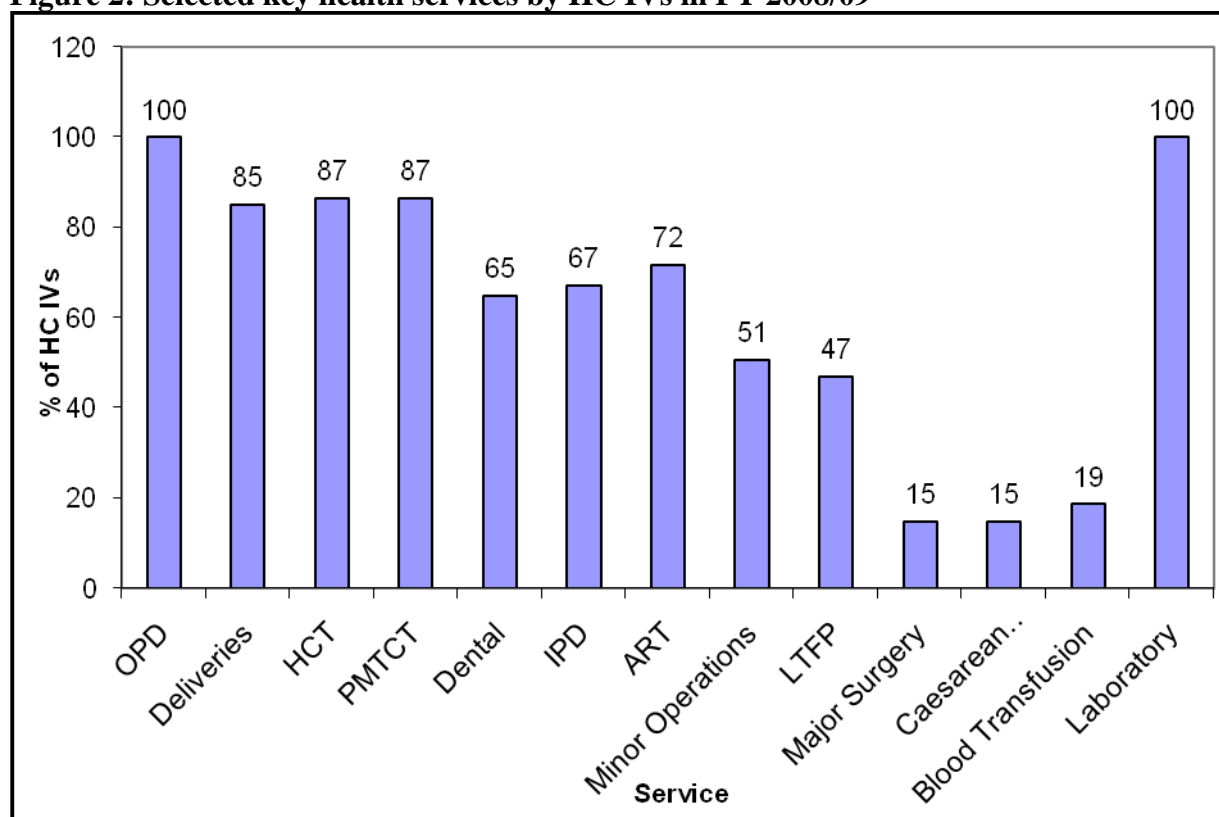
The HC IV is an innovation of the 1999 National Health Policy. The key feature of the HC IV strategy is to provide basic promotive, preventive and curative services including emergency surgical and obstetric services, in order to address the poor health indicators such as infant mortality rate and maternal mortality ratio. Being a key strategy for the sector the functionality of HC IVs is a key objective in providing special components of the UNMHCP.

This section presents the functionality of HC IVs in the FY 2008/09. Data was received from 134 HC IVs out of 160(84%) functional HC IVs and this was the basis of the analysis for this section.

3.2.1 PROVISION OF SELECTED KEY HEALTH SERVICES BY HC IVs IN FY 2008/09

HC IVs are expected to provide services as spelt out in the Health Sector Policy of 1999. Analysis of provision of selected key components of the minimum service standards is shown in the graph below.

All HC IVs were noted to be offering OPD and laboratory services. Services that were below average (50%) included; LTFP, major surgeries, caesarian sections and blood transfusion (for individual HC IVs details on services provided, refer to appendix I).

The total number of patients who accessed these services in FY 2008/09 are as shown in table 10 (for details on individual HC IVs services outputs, refer to appendix II).

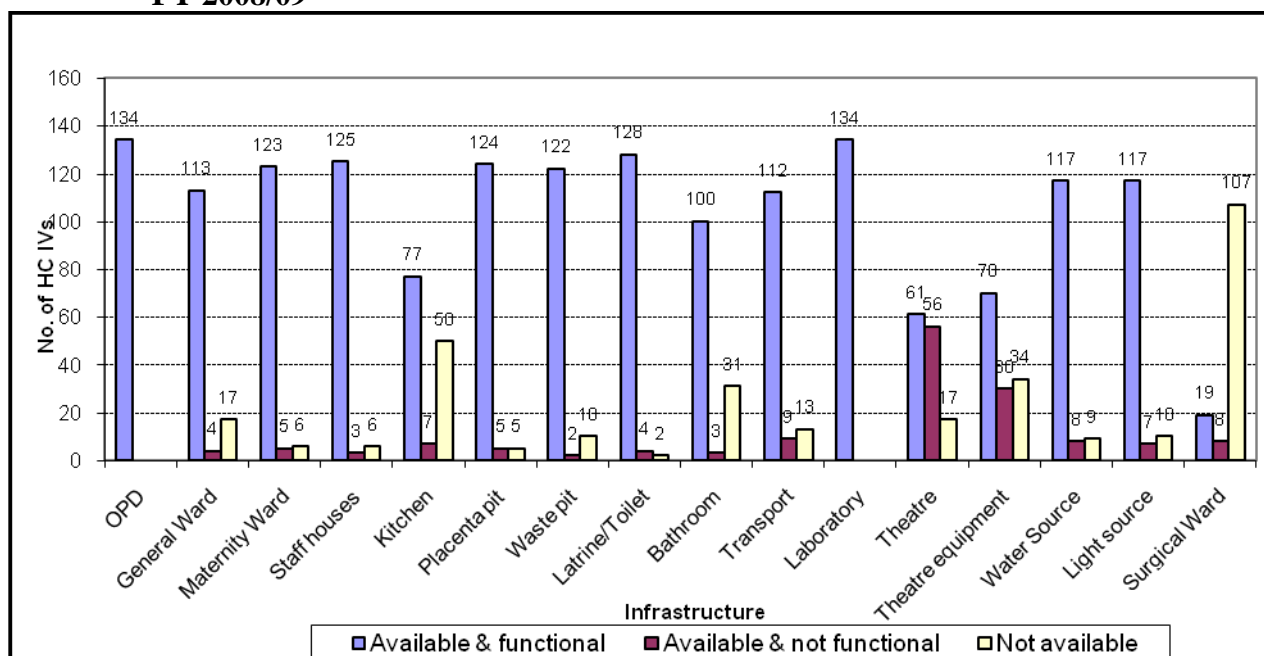

3.2.2 STATUS OF INFRASTRUCTURE AT HC IV IN 2008/09 FY

For HC IVs to function effectively certain key infrastructure should be in place. This information is submitted annually by the HC IVs, indicating their availability and functionality. The graph below shows the availability and functionality of infrastructure at HC IV level for FY 2008/09.

All the HC IVs had OPD and laboratory infrastructure. Out of the 134 health centre IVs, only 14% were noted to be having functional surgical wards and 46% had functional theatres. Additional infrastructure gaps at health centre IV level included; Availability of Kitchens, availability of functional bathrooms and availability of theatre equipment. (See appendix III for details on individual health centre IV infrastructure availability and functionality).

4.0 HEALTH OUTPUTS

This section presents a summary of some of the key health outputs including the district League Table and the HSSP II indicators. These indicators are used to measure the national and district performance in management and health service delivery.

4.2 DISTRICT LEAGUE TABLE

The league table (Appendix IV) compares sector performance between districts using management and service delivery output indicators. The management indicators show the use of the PHC-CG, expenditure on key inputs, proportion of the fiscal decentralization strategy allocated to the health sector and the management of health data.

The national league table performance average improved steadily in the last three years from 60.5% (2006/07), 62% (2007/08) to the current 65%. Closer analysis is made of the top and bottom 15 which represents about 37.5% of all districts. Districts that have consistently remained in the top 15 in the last three years are Kampala, Jinja, Tororo, Gulu, and Mityana. Districts that have consistently remained in the bottom 15 are: Kibaale, Yumbe, Nakapiripit and Maracha-Terego. Good management does appear to have a role in the district performance. Characteristics that are common to all districts in the worst performing category include: poor social infrastructure (pit latrine coverage) and zero spending or not reporting on PHP funds that are disbursed.

4.3 TIMELINESS AND COMPLETENESS OF HMIS REPORTING

Appendix V and VI show the district submission status of the outpatient and inpatient monthly reports at the Resource Centre where **T** represents a timely report (report received by the 28th of the next month) **L** for a late report (report received after the 28th of the next month) and the **N** for no report from a particular district for the month.

In FY 2008/09 the timely reporting for outpatient dropped from 79% to 78%. This might have been contributed to by a number of factors like formation of new districts, recruitment of new staff in the districts, and the changing of information systems (e.g. change to electronic reporting system and the formats) both at the centre and in the districts, plus lack of reporting HMIS tools.

On the other hand, timeliness of inpatient reporting for the same period was 55% while completeness was 67%. It should be noted that timelines and completeness for outpatient are higher than inpatient reporting.

4.4 OUTPATIENT INDICATORS

The summary of outpatient indicators for FY 2008/09 is shown in table 14 below (see appendix VII for the individual district details).

Total Government and PNFP OPD utilization per person per year (OPD Per Capita) is among the HSSPII indicators. It measures utilization of health services in both government and PNFP health facilities and is the national proxy for access to health care services. It is expected that each individual should visit a health unit at least once in a year. During FY 2008/09, this indicator stagnated at 0.8 compared to the previous FY, below the HSSP II target of 1.0. The proportion of health facilities reporting in 2008/09 is lower compared to 2007/08 and this may account for the stagnation in this indicator.

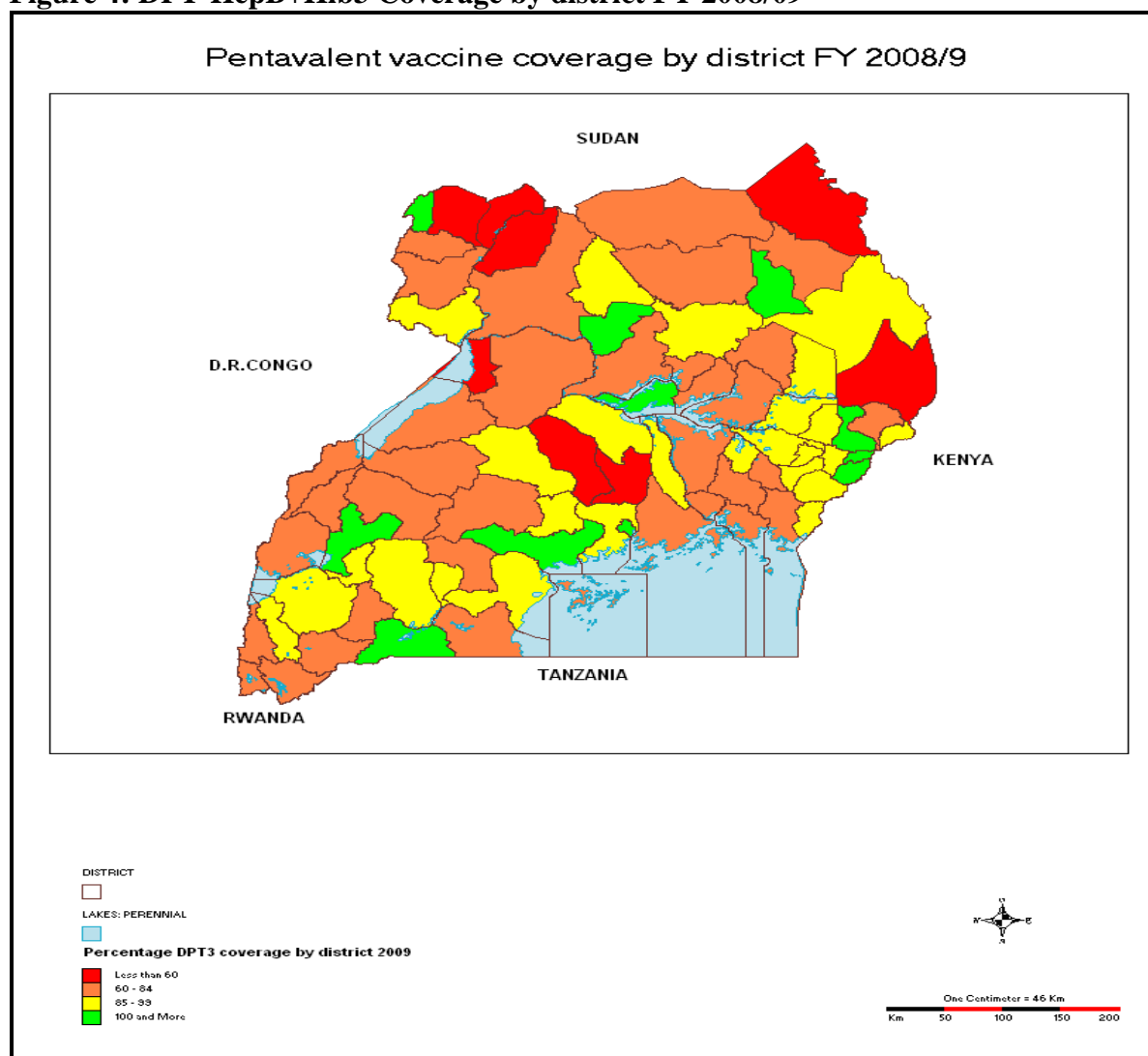

4.6 OTHER CHILD HEALTH INDICATORS FY 2008/09

Vitamin A supplementation and de-worming are two among various strategies by the Ministry of Health to address micronutrient deficiencies among children and pregnant mothers.

From table 14 below, it can be observed that the proportions of Under 5's given the 2nd vitamin A supplementation dose and those de-wormed with a 2nd dose, in most districts were below 50%.

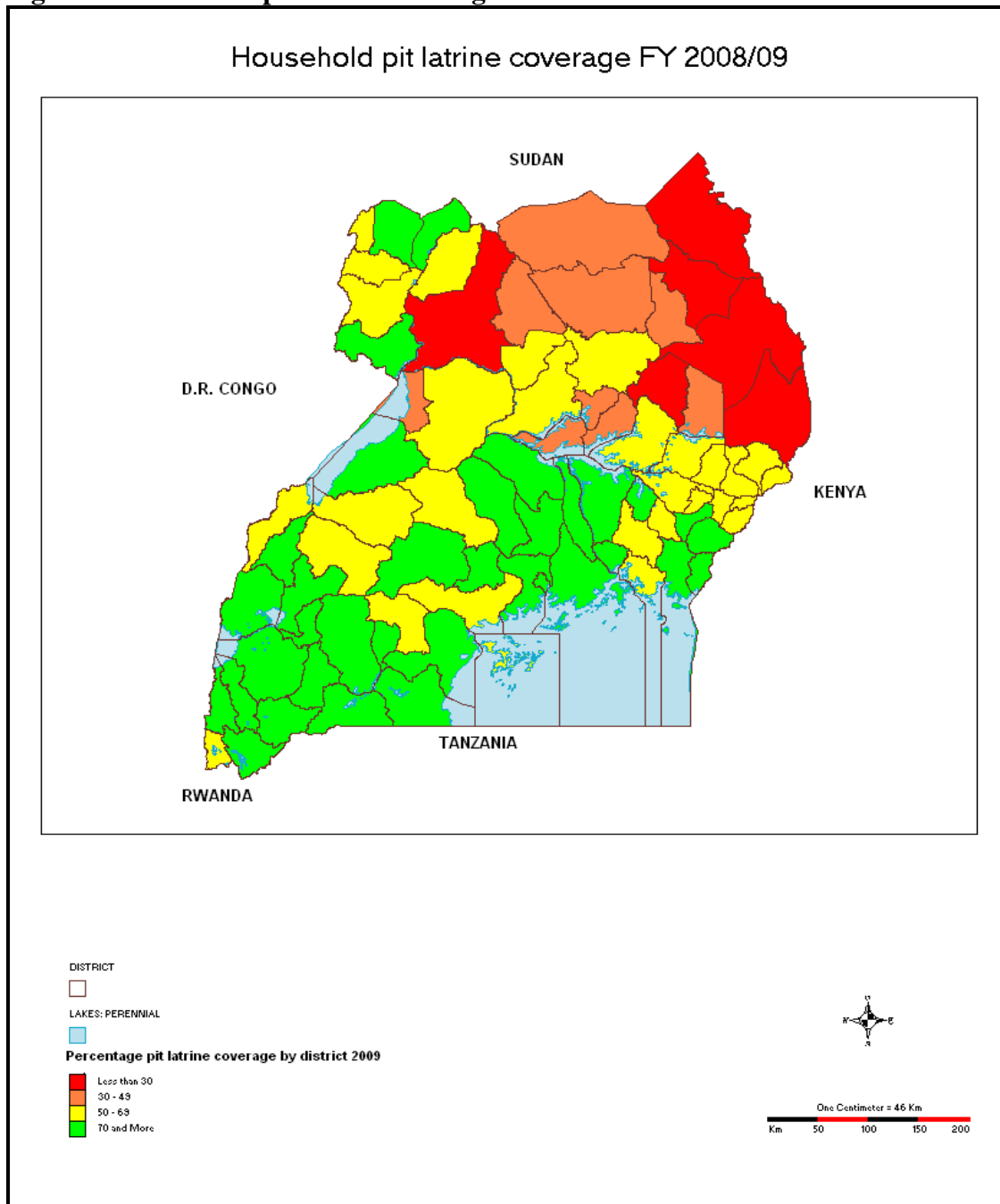

The current national latrine coverage stands at 67.5%, up from 62.4% in FY 2007/08. This increase is mainly attributed to the enforcement of the Public Health Act. District specific latrine coverage ranges from less than 5% in Abim, Kaabong and Nakapiripirit to 92% in Bushenyi. An important lesson from the better performing districts and municipalities in Uganda with respect to sanitation is that the active involvement of leaders at all levels is important for allocation of budgets to hygiene and sanitation and enforcement of local sanitation by-laws.

4.8 LABORATORY INDICATORS FOR FY 2008/09

The proportion of OPD cases diagnosed as malaria and took a malaria test were only 22% nationally. This implies that 78% of cases that are treated with anti-malarial drugs are without a confirmatory test. Only Kampala and Gulu districts had 50% or more of their OPD cases tested for malaria. In addition, those that get tested 41% were positive for malaria. While TB slide positivity rate for all age groups stood at 20%.

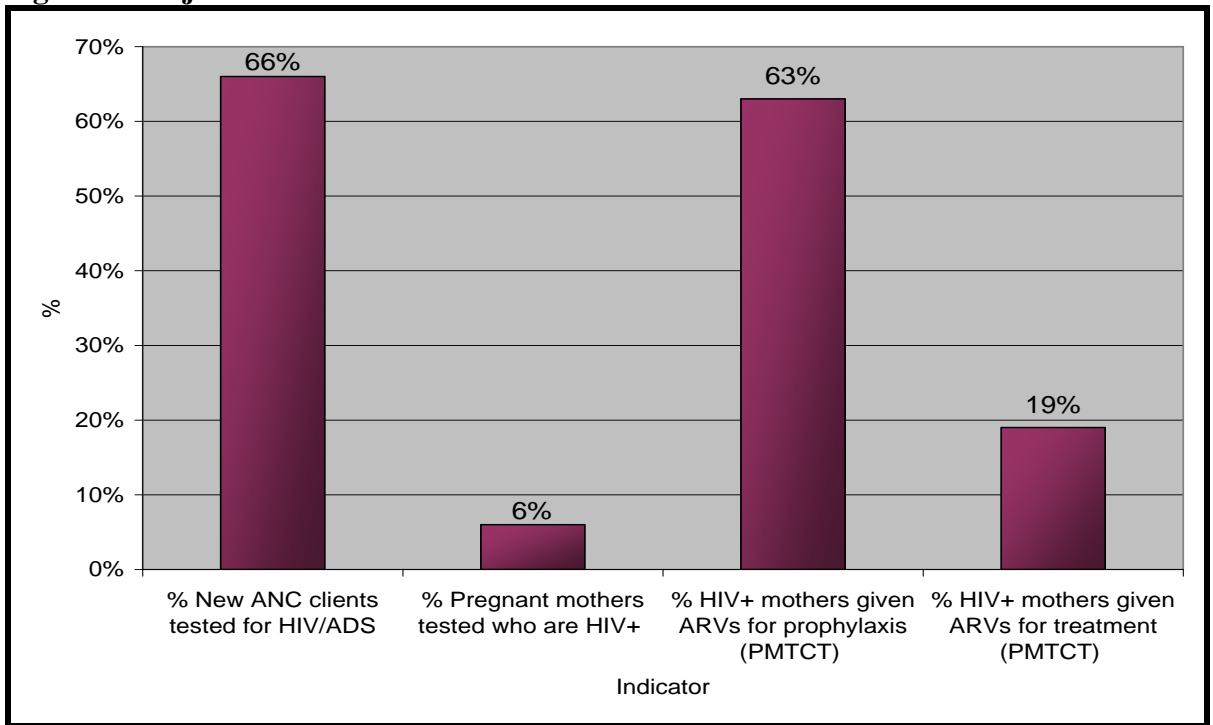

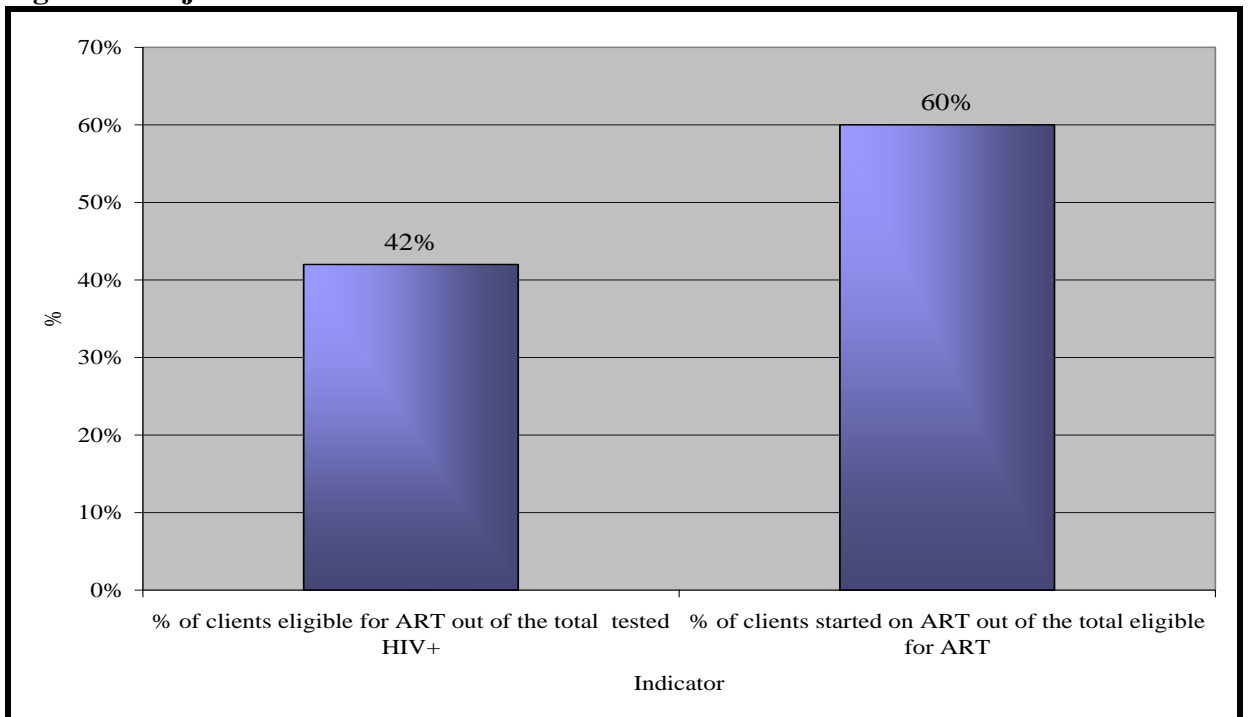
Figure 6: Major PMTCT National level Indicators FY 2008/09

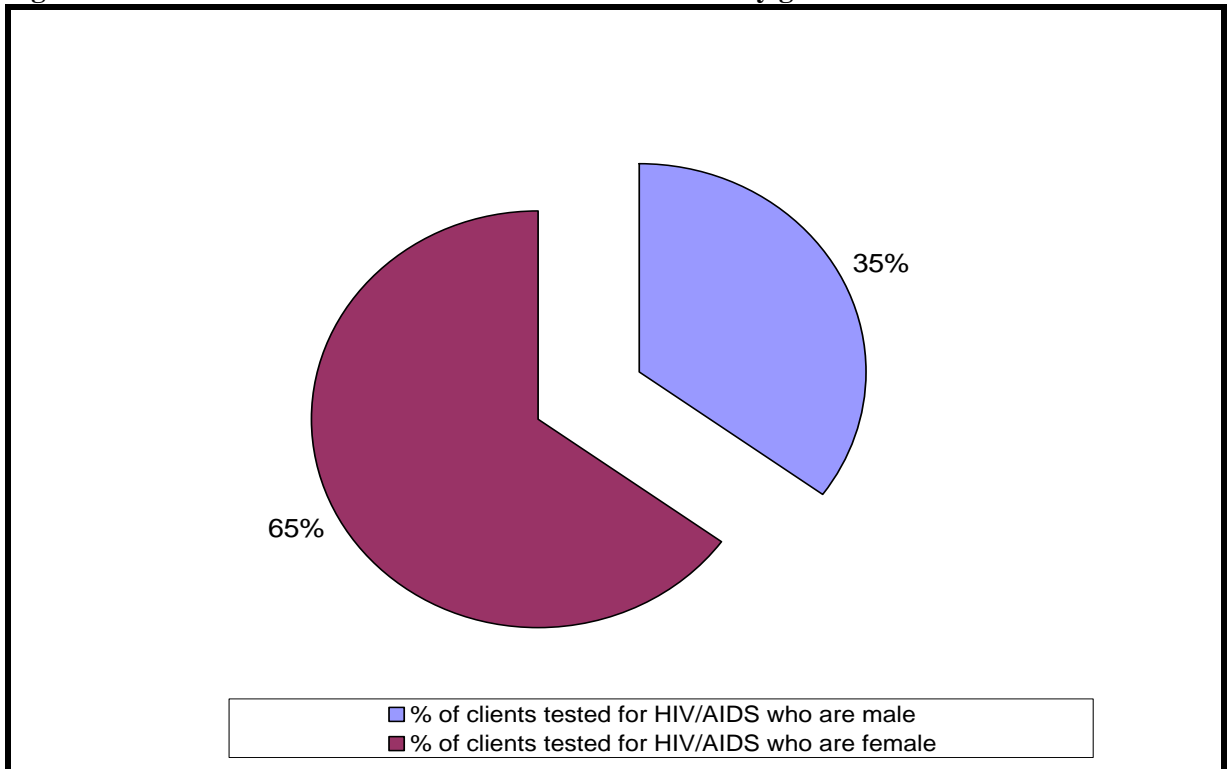
Figure 7: Major ART Indicators FY 2008/09

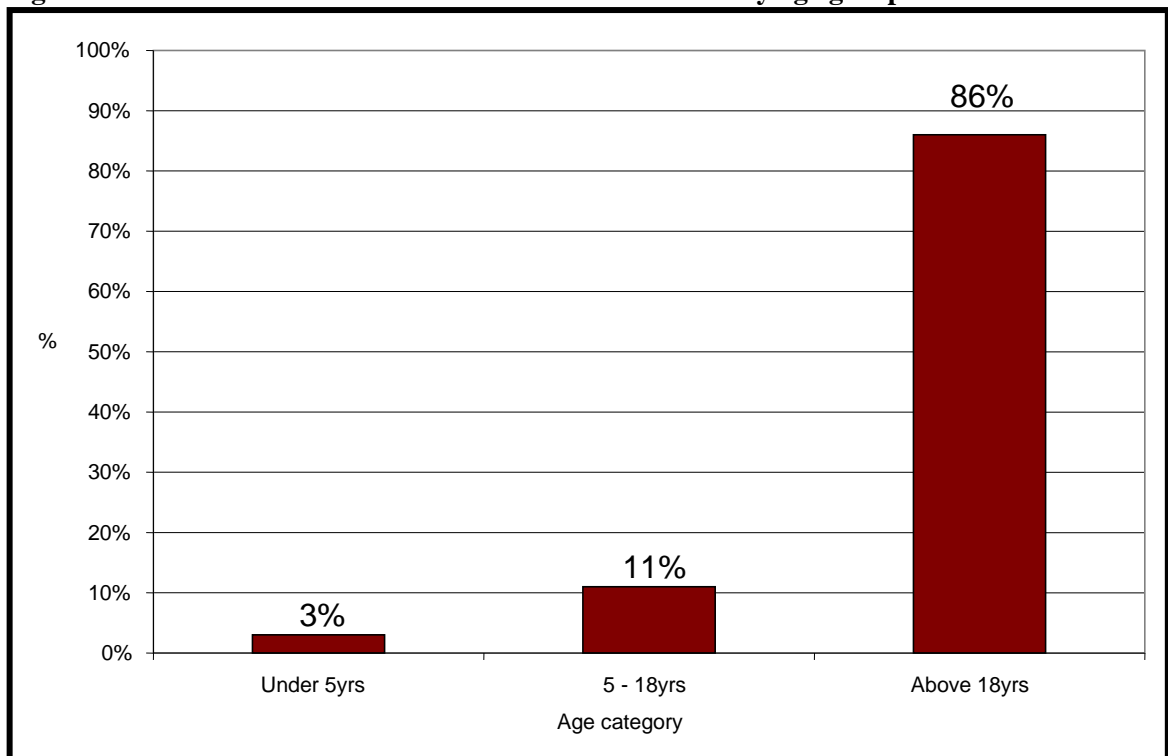

Figure 11: Proportion of Pregnant women receiving 2nd dose of Fansidar (IPT 2)

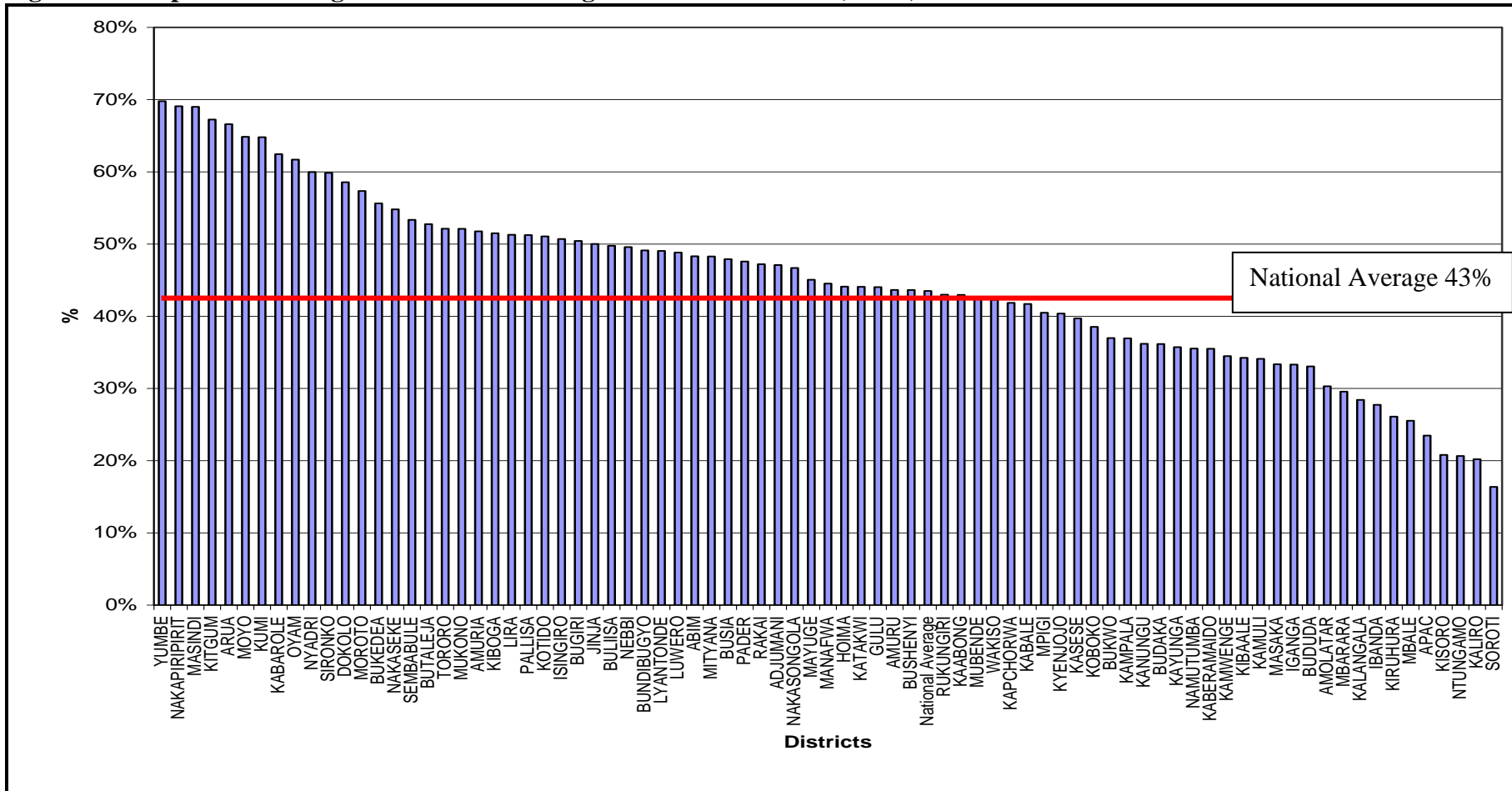


Figure 11 above shows the proportion of pregnant women who reported receiving a 2nd dose of Fansidar for Intermittent Presumptive Treatment (IPT) of malaria, by district. Districts with a high proportion include Yumbe, Masindi, Kitgum, and Kumi with 70%, 69%, 67% and 65% respectively. The national proportion of pregnant women who reported receiving a 2nd dose of Fansidar for IPT of malaria was 43%, while that for 2007/08 was 39%. This is an upward trend and a sign that more pregnant women have accessed the 2nd dose of Fansidar. However this did not meet the HSSP II target of 50% for this FY.

4.11 STOCK OUT OF ESSENTIAL DRUGS BY DISTRICT IN FY 2008/09

A stock out of a given drug implies that a health facility didn't have that particular drug at some point in time during the FY. Table 17 below presents data on stock outs of essential drugs namely first and second line drugs for malaria, ORS, measles vaccines and HIV test kits among others. According to available data, the national average for health facilities with stock outs of the 1st line drugs for malaria is 26%. 21 districts reported having 0% or no stock outs in the health facilities while Nakapiripirit and Amolatar had stock outs of the 1st line malaria drug in all the health facilities during the FY.

Nationally, health facilities with stock outs of measles vaccines in FY 2008/09 accounted for 15%. Further analysis also shows that 21 districts had no stock outs of measles vaccines. Notable among the districts with stock outs of measles vaccines are Nakapiripirit and Kaabong with 100% and 96% respectively. This implies that all facilities in Nakapiripirit had measles vaccine stockouts while only 4% of the health facilities in Kaabong experienced no measles vaccine stockouts.

Overall health facilities with no stock outs of the essential drugs, vaccines and contraceptives at the national level accounted for 41%. In this category 16 districts had all their facilities with no stock outs or 0%. Iganga, Lyantonde and Kabale had 96%, 94% and 90% respectively in this overall indicator, implying that most of their health facilities experienced no stockouts.

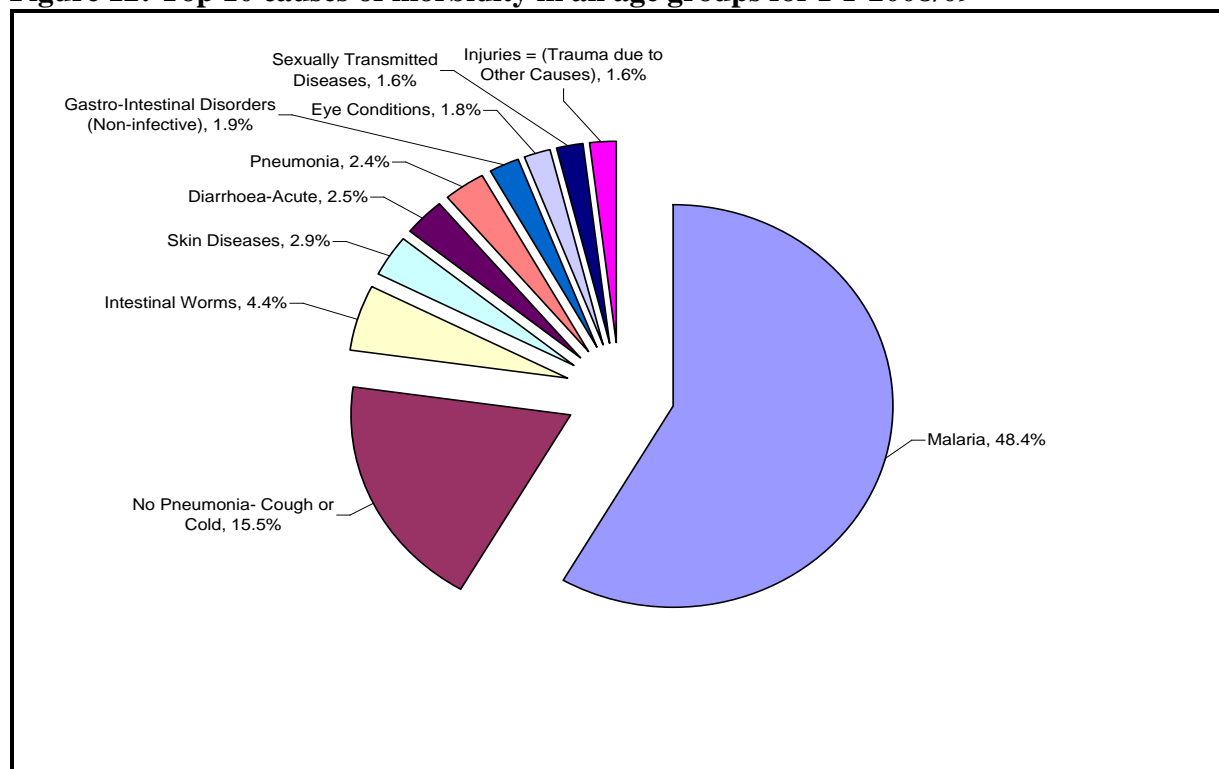

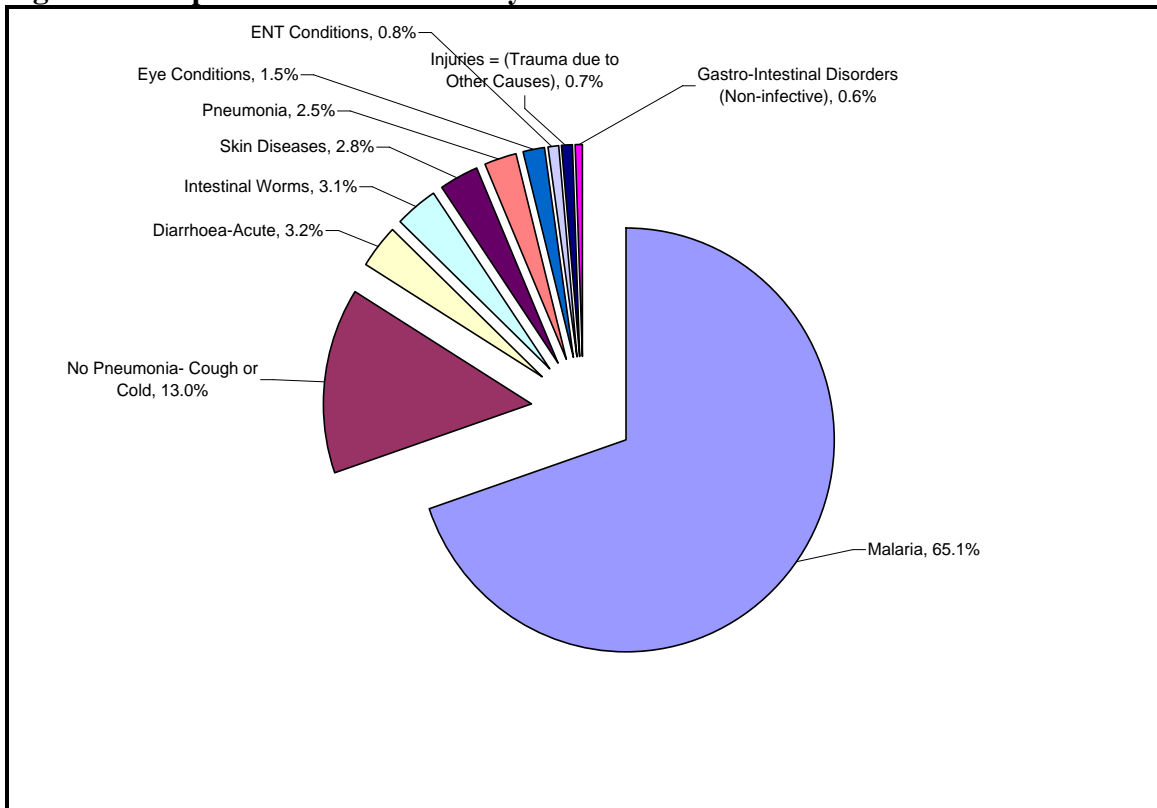
Figure 12: Top 10 causes of morbidity in all age groups for FY 2008/09

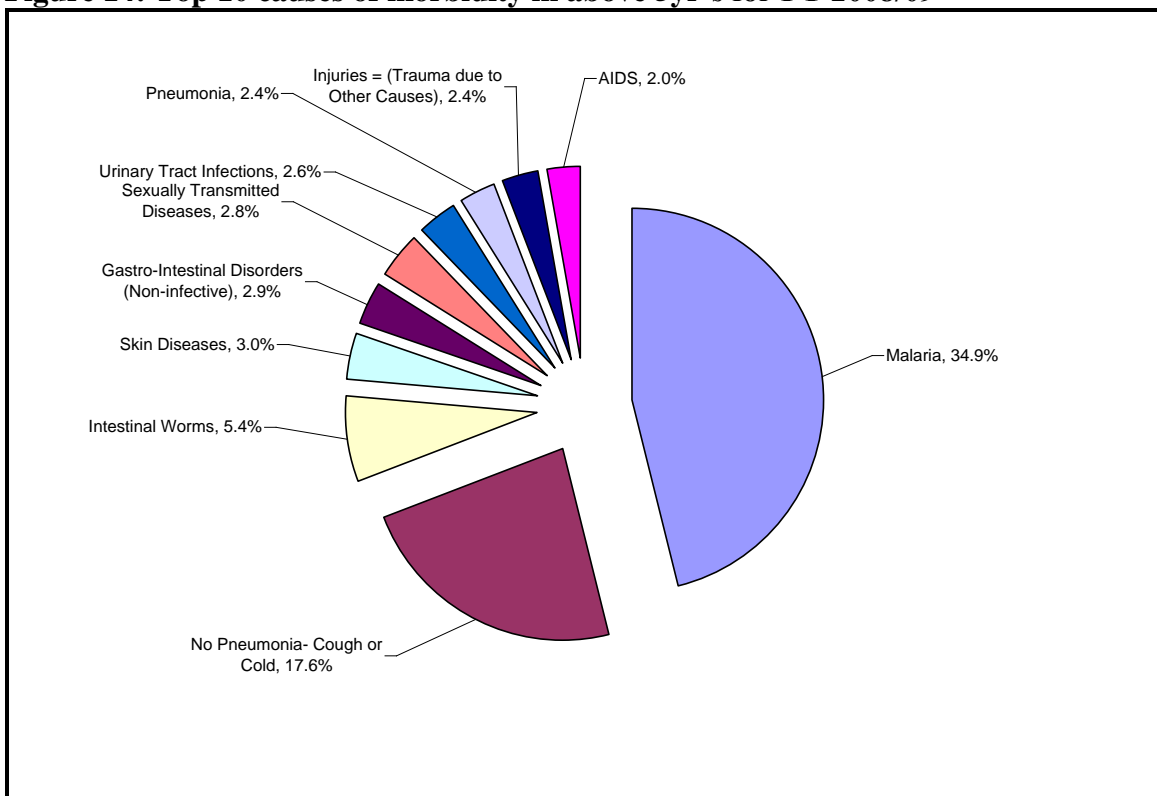

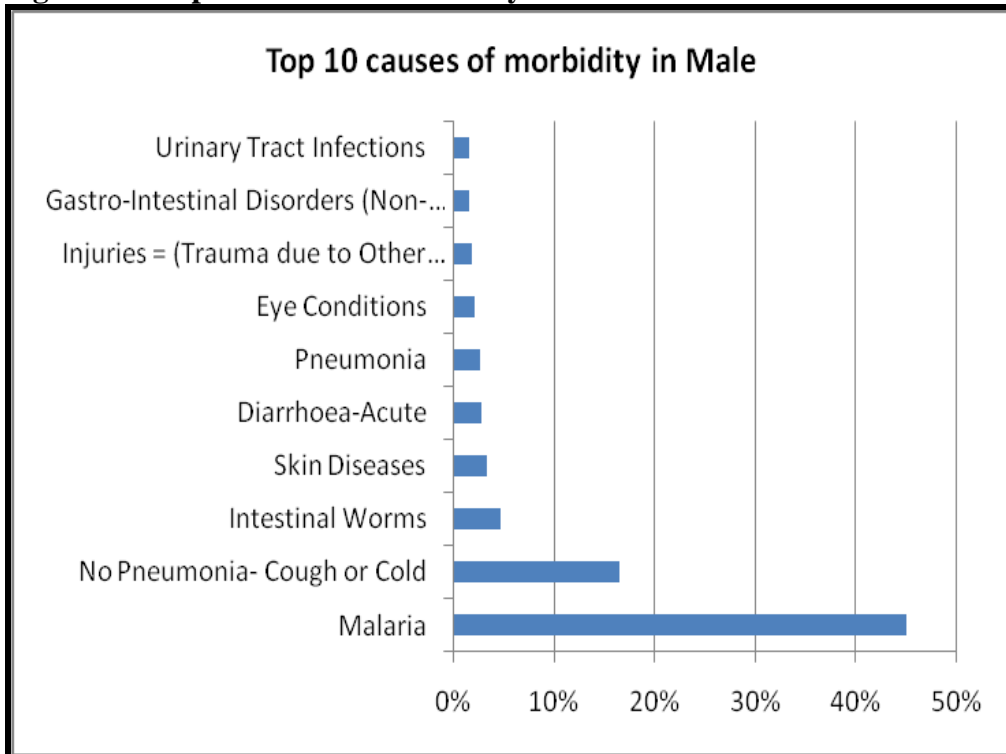
Figure 14: Top 10 causes of morbidity in above 5yr's for FY 2008/09

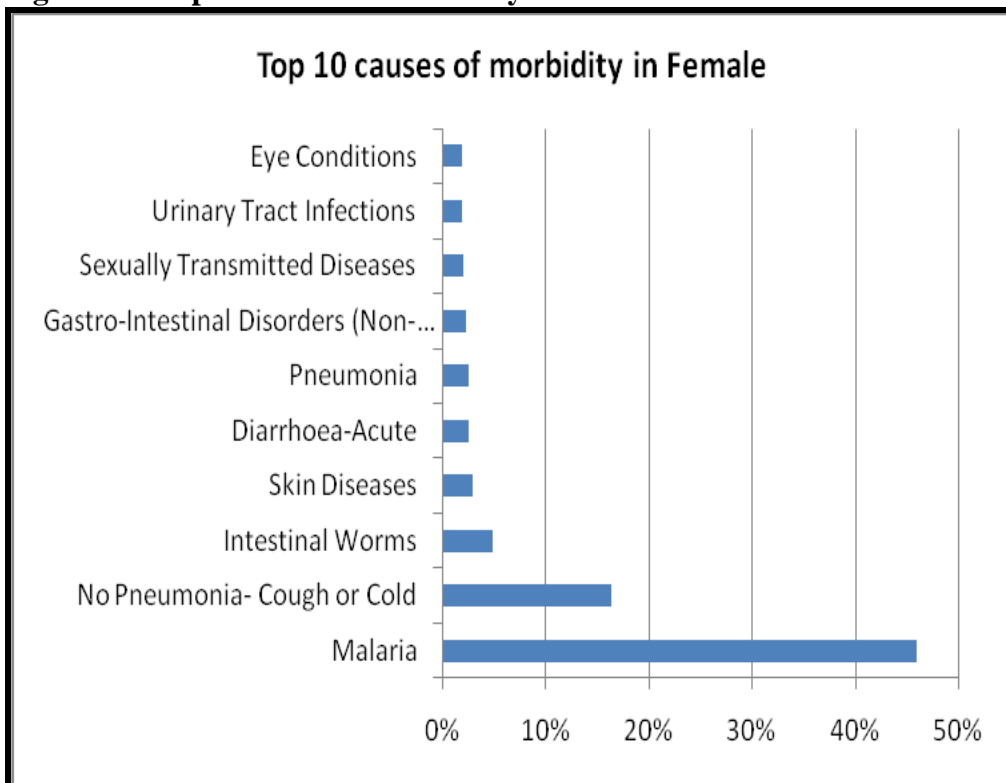

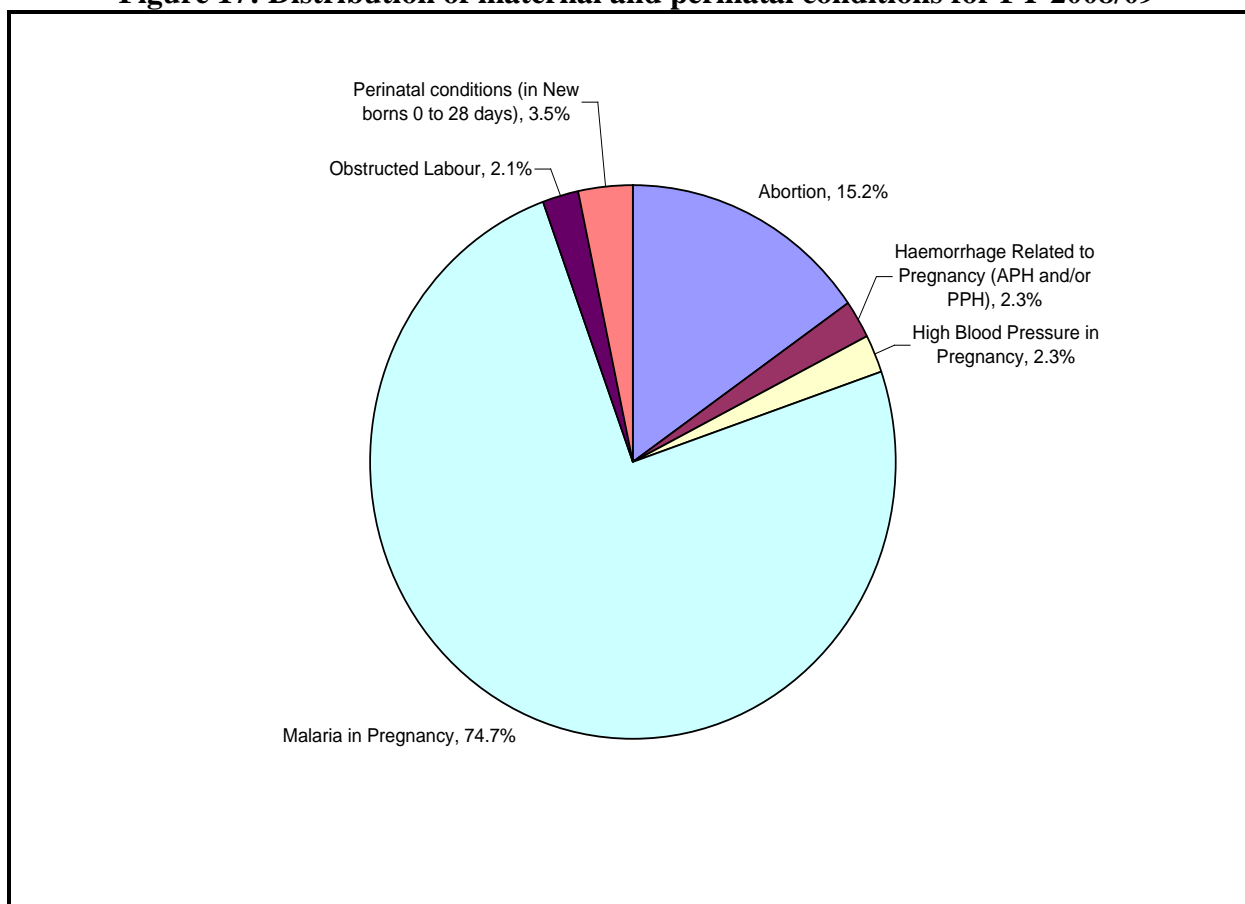
